**NO. 8 DAYTON FLYERS vs. NO. 9 TCU LADY FROGS POST-GAME NOTES**

**NO. 8 SEED DAYTON FLYERS NOTES**

- Dayton wins its NCAA Division I tournament debut after rallying from 18 points down (52-34) with 13:07 to play.
- Brittany Wilson scored the winner with 1.1 seconds remaining. Her basket was set up by Patrice Lalor, who grabbed an offensive rebound and made the assist for Wilson's short bank shot.
- Dayton held TCU without a field goal the last 4:15 while rallying from a 64-58 deficit. Two free throws by Helen Sverrisdottir with 17 seconds to play were the only points scored by the Horned Frogs during that span.
- The Flyers outscored TCU 33-14 over the game's final 13:07.
- Dayton shot just 27.6 percent (8-of-29) from the field in the first half -- their third-worst opening 20 minutes this season. But the Flyers rebounded for an even 50 percent (15-of-30) effort in the second half.
- Today's win kept alive Dayton's streak of not having lost consecutive games this season.
- The Flyers improved to 5-1 on neutral courts in 2009-10.
- Kendel Ross recorded her fourth double-double this season, with 17 points and 11 rebounds.
- Dayton led early 7-2 before TCU went on a 16-0 run to take its largest lead of the first half (18-7) at the 13:11 mark. The Flyers got no closer than three the rest of the half and didn't reclaim the lead until 65-64 with 32.1 seconds to play in the game.
- Dayton is 0-1 all time against Tennessee, having dropped a 66-40 decision in Knoxville back on Dec. 4, 1986.

**NO. 9 SEED TCU LADY FROGS NOTES**

- TCU had five players score in double figures led by junior Helena Sverrisdottir with 17.
- Svertisdottir also recorded her sixth double-double of the season with team highs in points (17) and rebounds (13)
- After trailing 7-2 just 1:10 into the game, TCU went on a 17-0 run to take a 19-7 lead at the 13:11 mark of the first half.
- TCU was led in the first half by senior TK LaFleur who was 5-of-5 from the field including a 3-pointer scoring all 11 of her points in the half.
- TCU went on a 9-0 run thanks to three straight 3-pointers, one from junior Rachel Rentschler and two from senior Eboni Mangum to stretch their lead to 18 at 50-32 at the 13:54 mark of the second half. It would be the largest lead of the game.
- TCU's record dropped to 16-2 when holding a lead at half after they had a 35-27 advantage at the break.
- TCU won the turnover battle for the 21<sup>st</sup> time this year forcing 16 by Dayton while only committing eight but dropped their record to 18-3 when holding that advantage.
- TCU was 14-of-15 from the free-throw line shooting 93.3% from the line compared to 12-of-19 and 63.2% for Dayton.
- TCU was outrebounded by Dayton 47-44 marking this the 15<sup>th</sup> time this season they have been out rebounded dropping their record to 9-6 in those games.
- TCU's overall record in the NCAA Tournament dropped to 5-9, having not reached the second round in their last three appearances.
- The loss was TCU's third in a row after entering the tournament on a two-game losing streak.
